If you are like Judy and me, we cherish the holiday season more and more each year. Maybe it is

the nostalgia we feel as we reflect upon the experiences and substance of our lives and long for a return to simpler times or maybe it is the reality of our own lives as we celebrate the holidays without people who have left us for their spiritual homes. Whatever the reason, things of real importance to us, seem to take on a heightened urgency and stronger meaning.

When Judy and I accepted the responsibility of chairing the fundraising effort for the capital campaign, there was a sense of urgency that we both felt about the project. Camp Judson has been a big part of our lives and we both wanted to ensure that younger generations had the same opportunities to find the living and loving Savior that we had found. Shortly, Tracy and Dani will be sending out their annual Camp Judson Appeal letter. Again this year, donations will be directed to the Capital Campaign. Please give as the Lord leads you. If you are now in your "Golden Years", as I am, you should check with your financial advisor and plan to make a donation to Camp Judson through a QCD (qualified charitable distribution)

from your IRA or another "tax advantaged" gift of other assets. We have reached 80% of our original \$4,000,000 campaign goal. Maybe this is the time we reach that goal. Work continues on the new building despite the onset of winter weather. The plumbing of sewer lines is complete. Tracy is evaluating bids for the plumbing of the fresh water supply system.

The concrete floor of the east half of the building will be poured during the next break in the weather and backfilling around the poured walls should begin soon. Be mindful that all this construction work is happening while Tracy and Dani are doing the logistical planning and prep for next year's camping season and Jake is performing necessary camp maintenance and repair. Continue to pray for those who make Camp Judson a "bright light in a dark world".
